Prayer

Read

Isaiah 9:6-7; Luke 2:8-17

Main Ideas

This week, we zeroed in on one of the four titles given to the Messiah in Isaiah 9: Jesus as the Prince of Peace. The purpose of Jesus' incarnation is to offer peace, not just between each other, but with God Himself. It is in trusting in Him as our salvation that we experience this peace that surpasses all understanding.

 - b. According to Paul, what kind of life do we have access to because of this peace?
- 4. As a group, read Matt. 10:34-36.
 - a. How do we reconcile this passage with all the times that Jesus comes as a person of peace?
 - b. What is Jesus trying to show us about Himself?
- 5. As a group, read John 16:33.
 - a. According to Jesus, what is the source of our peace?
 - b. What about Jesus' offer of peace speaks into the reality of a broken world?
 - c. Is there something in your life where you are experiencing the trouble of the world? How can we help you cling to this promise of peace?
